Purpose for which the funds will be used: To contract with nonprofit agencies for residential pre-

release programs for inmates committed to the New Jersey Department of Corrections.

Amount of funding available:

1. Total appropriation: \$65,959,000.

2. Allocated for ongoing programs: \$63,398,525.

3. Balance: \$2,560,475.

The Department's Fiscal Year 2015 budget request for the appropriation of funds in this grant

program is subject to approval by the Office of Management and Budget and the State Legislature.

Groups or entities which may apply: Nonprofit community based providers.

Qualifications needed by the applicant agency to be considered for a grant: Nonprofit

contractors that provide suitable programs and facilities that:

1. Conform with local building codes and zoning ordinances; and

2. Meet local and State health and fire codes.

Nonprofit contractors may subcontract with non-profit or for-profit vendors for the provision of

suitable programs and/or facilities.

Note: Nonprofit contractors that choose to subcontract with a for-profit contractor for the

provision of suitable program beds shall directly employ all key decision makers and

managers to oversee the contract. The sub-contractor must have a board of directors

whose membership is entirely distinct and different from that of the for-profit contractor.

Procedure for eligible entities to apply for funds: Qualified applicants must complete and submit

an application for contractual services for Residential Community Release Programs.
