

At the outset, it is noted that in order for experience to be considered applicable, it must have as its primary focus full-time responsibilities in the areas required in the announcement. *See In the Matter of Bashkim Vlashi* (MSB, decided June 9, 2004). The review of the duties the appellant submitted on his application does not have the construction, maintenance, and repair of streets as a primary focus. The majority of his work involved utilities. While the appellant repaired streets after installing utilities, this was ancillary to ensuring underground transmission of utilities.

The appellant provided another position, Boiler Repair Mechanic, on his resume with his appeal. Pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.1(f)*, any supplemental information received after the closing date cannot be considered. Nevertheless, this position was clearly inapplicable as well.

An independent review of all material presented indicates that the decision of the Agency Services, that the appellant did not meet the announced requirements for eligibility by the closing date, is amply supported by the record. The appellant provides no basis to disturb this decision. Thus, the appellant has failed to support his burden of proof in this matter.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this appeal be denied.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
