

What is the law?

According to Title 21 of the NJ State Administrative Code It is ILLEGAL in the State of New Jersey to <u>use</u>, <u>possess</u>, or, even <u>transport</u> fireworks.

Each year New Jersey law enforcement officials confiscate thousands of illegal fireworks in our state.

Here are three excellent reasons: why...

FIREWORKS SAFETY ANSWERS

THE FOLLOWING INCIDENTS WERE RECORDED IN THE CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION ANNUAL FIREWORKS INJURY REPORT OF 2012

REASON #1

A 17 year old created a "sparkler bomb" of 300 sparklers. when he attempted to place a bucket over the lit device, it exploded unexpectedly. The victim was pronounced dead at the hospital.

<u>REASON #2</u>

A 30 year old lit a mortar-type firework and the device failed to go off. The man looked inside the tube and the device exploded striking him in the face and causing a fatal brain injury.

<u>REASON #3</u>

A 60 year old male constructed an oversized device by combining elements of smaller consumer fireworks. The homemade device exploded unexpectedly, killing the man from blunt force trauma.

THE MOST IMPORTANT REASON FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL IN NEW JERSEY IS BECAUSE THEY ARE A THREAT TO HUMAN LIFE AND PROPERTY
