## WORKFORCE TRAINING PROGRAMS

**Green Job Training - Isles' Center for Energy & Environmental Training (NJCEET)**, developed with support of the NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development, provides entry level and advanced green job training for community members, workers seeking to enhance their skills and employers seeking customized training for employees. Participants are trained in areas of energy audits, alternative energy installation and maintenance, environmental hazard cleanup and green building. Those who successfully complete the program are provided with job placement assistance. Employers may be eligible for partial wage reimbursement. ## Grant Opportunities for Nonprofits and Unions

**The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009** is providing \$250 million in discretionary grants for projects funded to prepare workers for careers in energy efficiency and renewable energy sectors. Eligible nonprofit organizations, labor unions, faith- and community-based entities have until September 2009 to submit applications for two energy training grant programs under ARRA, specifically the Energy Training Partnership Grants and the Pathways Out of Poverty Grants.
