Time to Reunification



In 2012, 76.7% of the children exiting placement for reunification had stays of placement of less than 12 months. Thus our ranking on reunification was 8th out of the 52 States/District of Columbia/Puerto Rico, and as shown in the map below.

An additional 15.1% of children exiting placement for reunification had stays in placement of less than 24 months.

Thus 91.8% of children who exited placement for reunification in 2012, had stays of less than 24 months.
