Workshop Launches Clean Marina Program

he New Jersey Clean Marina Program was officially launched in late March when a special workshop was held to introduce the program to the marina industry, public and press. The New Jersey Clean Marina Program is a voluntary program that encourages marina operators and recreational boaters to protect coastal water quality by engaging in environmentally sound operating and maintenance practices that will help implement measures to minimize non-point source pollution from sources such as oil, grease, paint and cleaning chemicals, sediment, fish waste, and other discharges from boats.

The workshop, held at the Clarion Hotel and Conference Center in Atlantic City West outlined how the Program works and how marinas can get involved.

The project, funded by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Coastal Management Program through a grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is a cooperative partnership of the NJDEP Coastal Management Program, NJ Department of Transportation Maritime Resources, US Coast Guard Auxiliary, NJ Marine Sciences Consortium, Marine Trades Association of New Jersey, Delaware National Estuary Program, Barnegat Bay National Estuary Program, Manasquan River Watershed Association, Jacques Cousteau National Estuarine Research Reserve, Rutgers University, Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Ocean County, and US Fish and Wildlife Service.

According to Michael Danko, Workshop Coordinator, "In addition to providing marina owners and operators with a comprehensive guide to regulations and best management practices the program will also give recognition to marinas that have taken additional steps to protect our waterways".
