Stream School 2017

An introduction to stream ecology and biological monitoring for citizen scientists

This two-day classroom and field workshop is sponsored by New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Division of Water Monitoring and Standards and South Jersey Land & Water Trust. Participants will be introduced to basic stream ecology and biological monitoring and assessment techniques for streams and rivers. Attendees will learn how to collect and identify the organisms (e.g. bugs) living in the waters which are key indicators of stream health. Participants will be ready to join existing local volunteer monitoring efforts or even create a new monitoring and outreach program in their watershed.
