

Delaware River @ Trenton 1960's drought








Flow at Montague, NJ October 15, 2014

Montague Gage:


Flow Target = 1,750 cfs

Estimated average base flow (9/8 to 10/15, 2014) = 641 cfs (36% of target).







SIMPLE (SIMPLE) Surface Water Supply Budget





- California Proposition 1
- \$7.5 Billion Bond Fund for Water
- Passed overwhelmingly 66.8% to 33.2%
 - Water Storage Capacity \$2.7B
 - Watersheds and Flood Management \$1.8B
 - Groundwater protection and cleanup \$0.9B
 - > Water conservation and storm water \$0.8B
 - Water recycling and desalination \$0.7B
 - Safe drinking water \$0.5B




