Quick Content Checklist - Essential Components of a Revised CCMP

- Identify changes between the existing and draft CCMP (comparison table mentioned under 5 below, but seems more applicable here – appendix?)
- Describe the NEP contribution to new information shaping actions and any changes (SOE, Climate Change)
- Map of the study area and reasoning for any boundary changes.
- Management Conference membership, reason for any changes, how it will support the NEPs ability to oversee, promote, fund CCMP implementation.
- Discussion of action plans and relationship to goals, priority problems, measurable objectives. Including:
 - proposed action
 - · key activities
 - · responsible parties

- timeframe
- cost range, sources of funding
- performance measures
- Monitoring approach to tracking/detecting changes, improvements effectiveness with:
 - objectives
 - data and parameters
 - responsible parties
 - frequency of collection, reporting

- how shared, stored, used
- data gaps
- changeswith revisions
- link toState of the Estuary

Content Checklist - Essential Components of a Revised CCMP

Include a Monitoring approach to track and detect changes and/or improvements within the study area (so change in environmental indicators can be detected over time), and effectiveness of CCMP Actions. This can be described in a separate, brief, higher level document, or chapter or action in the CCMP. The Monitoring approach should identify: a) objectives, b) data the NEP and partners are collecting for which parameters; c) the party/parties responsible for collecting the data; d) frequency of collecting and reporting the monitoring data; e) how the data are shared, reported, and used; f) data gaps; and g) additional funding needed for monitoring activities and filling data gaps. This section should explain how monitoring has/will change as a result of new/modified actions and priorities, and any new environmental indicators. Monitoring should be tied to the State of the Bay Report which has similar components. Please note: A Quality Management Plan or Quality Assurance Project Plan can supplement the Monitoring Plan, but does not in and of itself meet this requirement.
