

WORKSHOP DISCUSSION SCENARIO

The turn of the century is a time of looking back to see where we have been, and a time of looking forward to see where we need to go. The key question is not whether the glass is half-empty or half-filled, but rather why is it not full?

What is your view of a full glass for the Delaware River and its watersheds? Could it be a picture of:

- * diverse natural resources;
- * healthy and balanced biological populations;
- * open space and scenic vistas;
- * multiple outdoor recreational opportunities;
- * pleasing places and livable communities;
- * a clean environment;
- * ample water supplies;
- * a vibrant economy;
- * geniality and fairness;
- * less regulations/less government;
- and, * opportunities for all, orY?

The full glass vision may also mean that people work together as a community to sustain this vision for future generations.

APPROACH: A series of regional workshops will focus on the components of a full glass@vision for the Delaware River and its Basin; and the conflicts, problems, and issues needed to be resolved to attain this vision. The insights derived from the workshops will be used to develop directions and action items. Findings will be presented at the Governors= Summit in September and at the Basinwide Conference in October, 1999.

This report will be available to guide future plans and programs.

Each workshop will begin with a short opening session. Workshop participants will then breakout into **four interest groups** to identify vision components, issues, programs, priorities and measurable outcomes for future planning. The four interest groups to be used in the process are:

- **Preservation and Advocacy** including land trusts; greenways; watershed associations; advocacy groups; grant-making foundations; historical preservation groups; environmental educators; community development organizations; interested citizens and others.
- **Commerce and Utilities** including agriculture; builders, developers, and realtors; port and economic development; labor; engineering and business consultants; water supply purveyors; wastewater dischargers; transportation; banks and other financial institutions; environmental consultants and others.
- **Recreation Providers and Users (non-government)** including equipment retailers; skiers; liveries; marinas; guide services; campgrounds and lodging; anglers, hunters, birders; hikers, bikers, campers; outfitters; outdoor people and others.
- **Government** including local, state, regional, and federal agencies; elected officials; and educational institutions.

Full participation is essential for success.
