### Day 7 – Saturday, June 28

In Morning - Break camp at Amico Island Park, near Riverside N.J., and move vehicles to Burlington N.J.'s Waterfront Park/Oneida Boat Club.

8:00 A.M. **Register** and check-in at the pavilion at Burlington, N.J. Waterfront Park at the **Oneida Boat Club**.

8:00 A.M. **Breakfast will be served at Oneida Boat Club; Boxed lunch will also be distributed.**

9:00 A.M. **Shuttle** departs Oneida Boat Club for Quaker Penn Park in Pennsylvania (adjacent to Pennsbury Manor)

10:00 A.M. **Safety Talk and Launch**

Paddle 6 miles to Mantinick Island (aka Burlington Island)

12:30 P.M. **Lunch** on Mantinick Island beach at entrance to lake with programs.

1:30 P.M. Resume paddling around the Island to the ceremonial grounds. **Programs and Ceremonies** including tours of some of the Island attractions.

3:30 P.M. Continue paddling to Oneida Boat Club for finale.

**Take-out** at Oneida Boat Club – Ice cream celebration and Sojourn ending celebration – Group Photographs

Sojourners may return to Mantinick Island to Camp (will be able to shower at Curtins Wharf Restaurant and Marina)

**Camping at Amico Island Park on Friday night and on Mantinick Island on Saturday night (optional)**

**Note:** Sun Showers only at Amico Island Park. Will be able to shower at Curtins Wharf Restaurant and Marina on Saturday evening. Paddle and powerboats will be available to help transport camping gear to Mantinick Island for Saturday night.

## Directions from Amico Island Park to Waterfront Park/Oneida Boat Club, Burlington, N.J.

The Oneida Boat Club is part of Waterfront Park in Burlington, New Jersey, just south of the Burlington Bristol Bridge (Rt. 413).

Estimated Driving Time: 20 minutes; about 10 miles

<b>START</b>	Take Norman Ave. back towards Lake Street.	0.3 mi
←	Turn Left onto St. Mihiel Drive/NJ 543	0.2 mi
→	Turn Right onto S. Chester Ave.	1.5 mi
← 	Turn Left onto Burlington Pike/US 130 North; continue to follow US 130N	6.7 mi
←	Turn Left onto High Street/CR 541; continue to follow High Street to the river	~ 1 mi
→	Turn Right. Look to your left, and you will see a TALL blue water tower and a building with a big sign, "Oneida". Turn left and park in lot by river or park in large lot before Oneida if bottom lot is full.	~ 0.3 mi

### General Directions to Waterfront Park/Oneida Boat Club:

The Oneida Boat Club is part of Waterfront Park in Burlington, New Jersey, just south of the Burlington Bristol Bridge (Rt. 413).

#### From US 130 in New Jersey:

Take exit for High Street. This is the main street through Burlington, N.J. Take High Street towards the River. Turn Right. Look to your left, and you will see a TALL blue water tower and a building with a big sign, "Oneida". Turn left and park in lot by river or park in large lot before Oneida if bottom lot is full.
