FINAL AGENCY DECISION

OAL DKT. NO. HMA 00462-16

As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, I have reviewed the record in this case, including the OAL case file and the Initial Decision approving the Settlement Agreement reached by the parties. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to file a Final Agency Decision is July 28, 2016 in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10, which requires an Agency Head to adopt, reject, or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of receipt. The Initial Decision was received on June 3, 2016.

This appeal stems from Horizon NJ Health's decision to reduce Petitioner's weekly private duty nursing services from 12 to 10 hours per day. However, by Settlement Agreement filed with the Office of Administrative Law,

the parties agreed to amicably resolve this controversy whereby Horizon NJ Health agreed to continue providing 12 hours of services per day, pending the results of the next assessment or upon a change in Petitioner's health condition.


The ALJ approved the Settlement Agreement because it was consistent with the law, fully disposed of all issues in controversy and was voluntarily entered into by both parties, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1.

I agree with the ALJ's conclusions regarding the Settlement Agreement and ADOPT the Initial Decision as based upon substantial credible evidence and consistent with applicable law.

THEREFORE, it is on this *6<sup>th</sup>* day of July 2016,

ORDERED:
