FINAL AGENCY DECISION

OAL DKT. NO. HMA 10244-16

As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, I have reviewed the record in this case, including the OAL case file and the Initial Decision approving the Settlement Agreement reached by the parties. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to file a Final Agency Decision is November 7, 2016 in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10, which requires an Agency Head to adopt, reject, or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of receipt. The Initial Decision was received on September 23, 2016.

This appeal stems from United Healthcare's reduction of Petitioner's personal care assistant (PCA) service hours from 35 to 24 hours per week. However, by Settlement Agreement filed with the Office of Administrative Law,

the parties agreed to amicably resolve this controversy whereby United Healthcare agreed to provide 27 hours of PCA services per week until the next assessment.

The ALJ approved the Settlement Agreement because it was consistent with the law, fully disposed of all issues in controversy and was voluntarily entered into by both parties, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1.

I agree with the ALJ's conclusions regarding the Settlement Agreement and ADOPT the Initial Decision as based upon substantial credible evidence and consistent with applicable law.

THEREFORE, it is on this ^{27th} day of October 2016,

ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision approving the Settlement Agreement in this matter is hereby ADOPTED.
