FINAL AGENCY DECISION

OAL DKT. NO. HMA 02946-16

As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, I have reviewed the record in this case, including the OAL case file and the Initial Decision approving the Settlement Agreement reached by the parties. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to file a Final Agency Decision is August 19, 2016 in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10, which requires an Agency Head to adopt, reject, or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of receipt. The Initial Decision was received on July 6, 2016.

This appeal stems from United Healthcare's termination of Petitioner's eligibility for medical day care services. However, by Settlement Agreement filed with the Office of Administrative Law, the parties agreed to amicably resolve this

controversy whereby Petitioner agreed to withdraw her hearing request and receive adult day care services at a nearby recreational center.


The ALJ approved the Settlement Agreement because it was consistent with the law, fully disposed of all issues in controversy and was voluntarily entered into by both parties, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 1:1-19.1.

I agree with the ALJ's conclusions regarding the Settlement Agreement and ADOPT the Initial Decision as based upon substantial credible evidence and consistent with applicable law.

THEREFORE, it is on this *3rd* day of August 2016,

ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision approving the Settlement Agreement in this matter is hereby ADOPTED.
