Participant Selection Criteria: Participants must demonstrate a working knowledge of ICS through experience and training, and must be experienced in delivering adult education. Participants must have worked as IC, Command or General Staff positions on incidents, planned events, or exercises that went longer than one operational period or involved a written action plan and involved multiagency coordination.

Prerequisites:

Required: IS-100.b, Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS), ICS-100; IS-200.b, Incident Command System (ICS) for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents, ICS-200; ICS-300, Intermediate Incident Command System (ICS) for Expanding Incidents; ICS-400, Advanced Incident Command System (ICS), Command and General Staff— Complex Incidents; IS-700.a, National Incident Management System (NIMS), An Introduction; and IS-800.b, National Response Framework (NRF), An Introduction.

NOTE: Participants must have taken the Emergency Management Institute, U.S. Department of Agriculture, National Fire Academy, or National Wildfire Coordinating Group ICS courses. Other ICS courses will be reviewed for consistency with the ICS objectives prescribed by the NIMS Integration Center. Participants must have had Adult Skills Presentation training such as Method of Instruction (MOI), Type II Fire Instructor Training or equivalent training to include a minimum of 32 hours of classroom work. Certificates for all pre requisites must be submitted with the application for the L449 course.
