Printed on Water-resistant Stock**

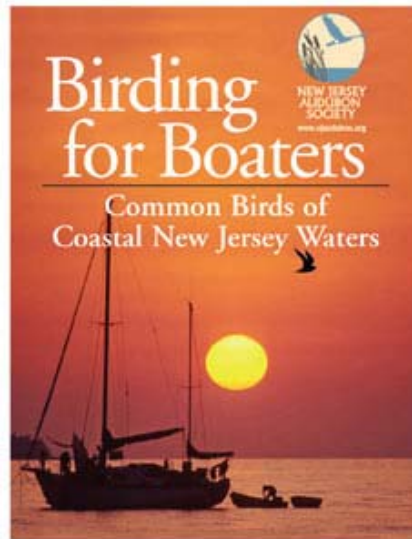


Did you know that in 2001, over 688,000 visitors to NJ watched wildlife? Many watch wildlife, including birds, while engaged in other outdoor activities, such as fishing or boating. Would you like to provide the boaters using your marina with some exciting information on what they’re seeing while enjoying New Jersey’s coastal waters? Then the *Birding for Boaters* brochure is for you!

### What’s Included?

1. Bird-friendly Boating Practices can minimize disturbances to nesting species, especially those designated “threatened” or “endangered” while enjoying a day on your boat.

2. Tips on identifying birds: provides guidelines on what to look for when watching birds, such as what habitat they are in, what the bird is doing, and unique markings on the bird.



3. Identifies 28 common coastal bird species: Each is listed by habitat. Each includes a full color photograph and description, with key characteristics of the bird to help with identification. These 28 are by no means the only birds you may see along our coastline. For a more complete list, contact your local New Jersey Audubon Society center.
