#### BY THE BOARD:

On August 13, 2014, Shorelands Water Company ("Company" or "Petitioner"), a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey, filed a petition ("Petition") with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") for approval to increase its rates for water service pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., to make other tariff changes pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.11, and to update the base consumption and base costs established in the Company's prior base rate proceeding, and used when setting the Company's Purchased Water Adjustment Clause ("PWAC") under N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq. in BPU Docket No. WR11120899<sup>1</sup>. The Company requested a rate increase of approximately \$1,017,052 or 9.86% above the adjusted annual level of present rate revenues for the test year ending December 31, 2014.

By this Order, the Board considers the Initial Decision recommending adoption of the Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") executed by the Company, Board Staff and the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") (collectively the "Parties") agreeing to an overall increase in revenues totaling \$650,000 representing a 6.33% increase over Company revenues of \$10,261,534.

#### BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Company serves approximately 11,000 water customers in its service territory which includes the Township of Hazlet and part of the Township of Holmdel; and connection service for bulk sales to the Borough of Keyport, the Township of Aberdeen, and New Jersey American Water Company, all of which are situated in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey.

The Company requested the increase in rates to become effective on September 15, 2014<sup>2</sup>. By Order dated September 30, 2014, the Board suspended the Company's proposed rate increase until January 15, 2015. On December 17, 2014, the Board issued an Order further suspending the proposed rate increase until May 15, 2015. The Petitioner did not seek interim rate relief pending final determination on the petition.

This matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") on September 9, 2014 as a contested case, and assigned to Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Irene Jones. A Pre-Hearing Conference was convened by ALJ Jones on December 12, 2014. On December 18, 2014, a Prehearing Order was issued setting forth a procedural schedule, and scheduling the matter for evidentiary hearings on March 17, 2015 and March 19, 2015.

After proper notice, a public hearing was held at the Hazlet Township Municipal Building in Hazlet, New Jersey at 5:30 pm on January 13, 2015. No members of the public appeared at the public hearing.

Subsequent to the public hearing, the Parties to the proceeding engaged in numerous settlement negotiations, and as a result of these discussions and extensive discovery, the Parties reached a settlement on all issues and executed a Stipulation.

On February 26, 2015, ALJ Jones issued her Initial Decision recommending adoption of the Stipulation, finding that the Parties voluntarily agreed to the Stipulation and the Stipulation fully disposed of all issues and was consistent with the law. No exceptions to the Initial Decision have been filed.

#### **DISCUSSIONS AND FINDINGS**

Among the provisions of the Stipulation<sup>3</sup>, the Parties agree that the Company's base rates be increased by \$650,000, representing an approximate 6.33% increase of the Company's revenues requirement. The Parties further agree to rate base of \$14,898,962 with a test year ending December 31 2014, adjusted for known and measurable changes, and that the Company be authorized a return on equity of 9.75%. The Parties also agreed that this return on equity will calculate to an overall authorized rate of return of 7.00%, derived from the overall capital structure of 55.11% equity with a cost rate of 9.75%, and 44.89% long-term debt with a cost rate of 3.63%. The capital structure does not include short-term debt.

As a result of this settlement, the average monthly bill for a typical 5/8" meter customer using 6,000 gallons of water per month will go from \$39.05 to \$42.64, an increase of \$3.59 per month.

The Parties agree that the tariffs attached as Exhibit B to the Stipulation, implementing the terms of the Stipulation, should be approved in their entirety, and recommend their approval by the ALJ and the Board.

Based on ALJ Jones's Initial Decision and the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the Parties have voluntarily agreed to the Stipulation, and that the Stipulation fully disposes of all issues in this proceeding and is consistent with the law. In reaching this decision, the Board must balance the needs of the ratepayer to receive safe, adequate and proper service at reasonable rates, while allowing the utility the opportunity to earn a fair rate of return. See FPC v. Hope Natural Gas, 320 U.S. 591 (1944); N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.S.A. 48:3-1. Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> the Initial Decision, which adopts the Stipulation, to be reasonable, in the public interest, and in accordance with the law. Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Initial Decision and the Stipulation, attached hereto, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if they were fully set forth at length herein, subject to the following:

- a. The tariff sheets attached to the Stipulation containing rates and charges conforming to the Stipulation and designed to produce the additional revenues to which the Parties have stipulated herein are <u>HEREBY ACCEPTED</u> for service rendered on and after March 28, 2015; and
- b. The stipulated increase and the tariff design allocations for each customer classification are **HEREBY ACCEPTED**.

Based upon the foregoing, the Board <u>HEREBY APPROVES</u> an overall increase in revenues in the amount of \$650,000 representing an approximate 6.33% increase over prior Company revenues.

The Board <u>HEREBY ORDERS</u> the Company to submit complete revised tariffs conforming to the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and this Order within five (5) days from the date of this Order.

This Order shall be effective on March 28, 2015.

BEFORE IRENE JONES, ALJ:

On August 14, 2014 petitioner, Shorelands Water Company, Inc. or ("Company") filed a petition with the Board of Public Utilities (BPU) seeking an increase in rates for water service and other specified tariff changes effective September 15, 2014.

OAL DKT. NO. PUC 11398-14

On September 10, 2014, the matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law for determination as a contested case pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 to 13. An in person prehearing conference was held on December 12, 2014. On January 13, 2015 a public hearing was held in Hazlet, New Jersey. Evidentiary hearings were scheduled for March 17 and 19, 2015 but adjourned because the parties agreed to settle the matter. A Stipulation of Settlement indicating the terms of settlement was filed with the undersigned on February 25, 2015.

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I have reviewed the record and terms of the Stipulation of Settlement and FIND:

- The parties have voluntarily agreed to the settlement as evidenced by the signatures of the parties or their representatives.
- 2. The settlement fully disposes of all issues in controversy and is consistent with law.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** that the parties comply with the settlement terms and that these proceedings be and are hereby concluded.

I hereby FILE my initial decision with the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Board of Public Utilities does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10.

# TO THE HONORABLE IRENE JONES, ALJ, AND THE BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

This Stipulation of Settlement resolves all issues raised in BPU Docket No. WR14080905 in which Shorelands Water Company, Inc. ("Shorelands" or the "Company") is seeking an increase in rates for water service and other specified tariff changes. The parties that have participated in these proceedings are as follows: Shorelands, the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, "Signatory Parties").

As a result of an analysis of the petition, pre-filed testimony and exhibits, several conferences, negotiations, responses to information requests, and a public hearing held in the service territory, the Signatory Parties to these proceedings have come to an agreement on the issues in dispute in this matter. The Signatory Parties hereto agree and STIPULATE as follows:

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On August 13, 2014, Shorelands, a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey, filed a petition with the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board") for approval to increase its rates for water service pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 and N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., to make other tariff changes pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.11, and to update the base consumption and base costs which were established in the Company's prior base rate proceeding and utilized when setting the Company's Purchased Water Adjustment Clause ("PWAC") under N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq. in BPU Docket No. WR11120899.1 In this current case, the Company requested a rate increase of approximately \$1,017,052 or approximately 9.86% above the adjusted annual level of present rate revenues for the test year ending December 31, 2014.

By letter dated September 2, 2014, the Company notified the board that it would not implement rates on an interim basis prior to the effective date of the Board's suspension order. On September 9, 2014, the Board transmitted the matter to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") and Administrative Law Judge Irene Jones was assigned to hear the case. On September 30, 2014, the Board issued its first Order suspending the proposed rate increase until January 15, 2015. On December 17, 2014, the Board issued its second Order further suspending the proposed rate increase until May 15, 2015.

A Prehearing Conference was convened by Judge Jones on December 12, 2014.

On December 18, 2014, the Prehearing Order was issued setting forth a procedural schedule and scheduling the matter for evidentiary hearings on March 17 and 19, 2015.

After proper notice, a public hearing in the service territory was held at the Hazlet

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Township Municipal Building, at 5:30 P.M. on January 13, 2015. No members of the public appeared at the public hearing.

The Company has provided a number of updates to its original case rate filing, including updated financial information regarding numerous aspects of the Company.

#### Settlement Terms

Numerous settlement discussions were held among the Signatory Parties, and this process resulted in the following stipulations among the Signatory Parties:

- For the purposes of this Stipulation, the Company's total rate base is agreed to be \$14.898,962. The test year is the 12 months ended December 31, 2014, adjusted for known and measurable changes.
- 2. For the purposes of this Stipulation, the overall rate of return agreed to by the Signatory Parties is 7.00%, which is based on a capital structure of 55.11% equity with a cost rate of 9.75% and 44.89% long-term debt with a cost rate of 3.63%. The Signatory Parties request that the Board approve a return on equity set at 9.75%.
- 3. The Signatory Parties agree that utilizing this overall rate of return of 7.00% results in an overall additional revenue requirement of \$650,000. This amount can be calculated as shown on the attached Schedule A.
- 4. The Signatory Parties stipulate that the revenue requirement for Shorelands should be set based upon a 9.75% return on equity and a 7.00% overall rate of return, resulting in an increase of \$650,000 over present rate revenues of \$10,261,534 or an overall revenue increase of approximately 6.33%. The Signatory Parties agree that this figure represents the level of revenue that will help to ensure that

the Company will continue to provide safe, adequate and proper water service to its customers. (See Schedule A).

- 5. The Signatory Parties agree and recommend that the attached tariffs implementing the terms of this Stipulation be approved in their entirety by the Administrative Law Judge and the Board. (See Schedule B). As a result of this settlement, the average monthly bill for a typical 5/8" meter customer using 5,000 gallons of water per month will go from \$39.05 to \$42.64, an increase of \$3.59 per month.
- 6. While agreeing for the purpose of this Stipulation to the results of the allocations as evidenced in the tariffs and Proof of Tariff (Schedule C) revenues attached to this Stipulation of Settlement, the Signatory Parties hereto have not agreed upon any specific allocation methodology or polloy in the resolution of the rate design issues raised in this procedure.
- 7. The Signatory Parties specifically agree that the cost of purchased water for the Year is \$2,480,112 as set forth below:

This Stipulation is the product of extensive negotiations by the Signatory 8. Parties and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Signatory Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all Issues specified and agreed to horein. The Signatory Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the Order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Signatory Parties have stipulated herein. The Signatory Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Signatory Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Signatory Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation. The Signatory Parties further agree that the purpose of this Stipulation is to reach fair and reasonable rates and that it will avoid protracted and costly litigation of certain issues and that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Signatory Parties shall be prohibited from or prejudiced in arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter.

9. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are signatories of this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
