Examination Appeal

Kenneth Kuzicki requests that he be permitted to submit an application for the promotional examination for Police Lieutenant (PM0966A), Vernon after the application filing deadline.

By way of background, the announcement for the Police Lieutenant (PM0966A), Vernon, examination was issued on July 1, 2019 with an online application filing deadline of July 22, 2019 and all applications had to have been submitted by that date. It is noted that that the subject test was administered on October 10, 2019. The announcement for the 2019 Law Enforcement Series examination (S9999A) was issued on July 1, 2019 with an online application filing deadline of August 31, 2019 and all applications had to have been submitted by that date. A review of the record finds that the appellant filed an application for the S9999A exam on July 18, 2019.

In an appeal filed on October 8, 2019, the appellant asserts that he "signed up for my Lieutenant's exam while using the online process that I received from my police department (Vernon Township Police Department). I received what I believed to be confirmation for the exam via email. After not receiving my information on where I would be testing, I contacted Civil Service and spoke with a representative and explained my situation. It was then determined that I somehow si[gn]ed up for the entry level exam [i.e., 2019 Law Enforcement Series Examination (S9999A),] which I would not do since I have been an officer for 18 years. Sir[,] I don't know how this happened."

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.1(e) provides, in part, that applications for promotional examinations shall be submitted no later than 4:00 p.m. on the announced application filing date. N.J.A.C. 4A:4-6.3(b) provides that the appellant in an examination appeal shall have the burden of proof.

While the appellant maintains that he "signed up for my Lieutenant's exam while using the online process that I received from my police department (Vernon Township Police Department)," the appellant neither provides a copy of that process nor describes it. However, it is noted that the subject announcement indicated that only online applications would be accepted and directed candidates to "visit www.state.nj.us/csc and select 'Job Announcements' to view this announcement and to file an application." Furthermore, it is also noted that the subject announcement, in the "Important Information" section, informed candidates:

If you are having difficulty submitting your application on-line, technical support and customer care are available during regular business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. EST, Monday-Friday, excluding holidays and emergency closings. Please email: OAS.support@csc.state.nj.us or call (609)292-4144. Please note that application support requests received outside of regular business hours on the closing date will not change the application filing deadline, so PLEASE FILE EARLY.

On the "Job Announcements" page, candidates for the subject announcement should have selected the "View **Promotional** Announcements here" link

Thus, candidates should have selected the link for "Job Announcements and Testing Information." It is noted that during the filing period for the Law Enforcement Series Examination (S9999A), July 1, 2019 to August 31, 2019, a specific link for that exam, "2019 Law Enforcement Announcement," was provided in the right column.

(https://info.csc.state.nj.us/epoa/).² Candidates for the subject test should have proceeded to the "Promotional Announcements for New Jersey Municipalities" section and used the pull-down menu in the "Select" box to choose "Vernon Township (SUSSEX COUNTY)." Once candidates selected Vernon, they would be taken to a screen (https://info.csc.state.nj.us/epoa/ListMunicipal.aspx) which listed all available promotional examinations for Vernon. It is noted that after a candidate selects a promotional symbol, he or she is taken to a warning screen in order to provide the candidate with another opportunity to verify that he or she is employed by the State, department, county or municipality, as applicable, before choosing to continue. If the candidate elects to continue, he or she is taken to a copy of the announcement which provides a link to begin the application process.

If an individual selected the link in the "Job Seekers" section for the 2019 Law Enforcement Series announcement, he or she would be taken to a copy of that announcement which provided, in pertinent part:



Furthermore, once an individual selected the link, under the "Requirements" section, to read the 2019 Law Enforcement Examination Fact Sheet, they were provided with the following, in pertinent part:

2019 Law Enforcement Examination (LEE) Fact Sheet

LEE Title Areas:

The Law Enforcement Examination (LEE) has been developed to assess candidate readiness for entry into law enforcement titles considered to have common knowledge, skills, abilities, and other

characteristics. Applicants file only one application and indicate their interest in the title areas by checking the box(es) on the application. A \$50 application processing fee is required for this announcement whether you check one or all title areas on your application. **No title areas can be added after the closing date.** Title areas you may select include the following:

Municipal Police Officer
 County Police Officer
 Park Police Officer
 Campus Police Officer Recruit*
 Police Officer Recruit Human Services*
 Police Officer Palisades Interstate Park*

- 2. Correctional Police Officer (Department of Corrections)*
- 3. Sheriff's Officer
- 4. County Correction Officer
- 5. Correctional Police Officer, Juvenile Justice Commission*
- *State Title

The S999A announcement also provided a link to apply via the Online Application System (OAS). After an applicant signed into the OAS, they were taken to the application for the S999A exam. It is noted that the following appeared at the top of each page of the application:

Moreover, as part of the application process, applicants were required to select the title area or areas they were interested in, as indicated above, which did not include Police Lieutenant. After entering all required information, applicants were taken to the payment page which provided the following at the top of the page:

As indicated above, an email containing this information was also sent to applicants.⁴ Finally, it is noted that on September 13, 2019, S9999A candidates were sent an email containing information regarding scheduling and preparation guides. The email provided in part:

Your application has been received and you have been found eligible to take the examination for one or more of the following law enforcement title(s): Law Enforcement Exam (S9999A), Parole Officer Recruit (S1000A), Parole Officer Recruit Bilingual in Spanish and English (S1001A), Parole Officer Recruit Juvenile Justice (S1002A) and Parole Officer Recruit Juvenile Justice Bilingual in Spanish and English (S1003A).

Carefully read/review the information provided in this email, it contains an attachment which pertains to the Preparation Material. The attachment will provide you with the instructions and a code for accessing the candidate preparation materials.

The examination for these titles will be administered on six test dates (two sessions on each test date -8:00 AM and 1:00 PM) at various Community College locations. The six test dates are . . .

Thus, as indicated above, S9999A applicants were clearly informed throughout the application process that they were applying for the Law Enforcement Series

examination (S9999A). In other words, at no point in the Law Enforcement Series application process is the PM0966A symbol, Police Lieutenant title or Vernon Township indicated.

In this regard, the appellant does not provide any explanation as to why he did not seek assistance when he was unable to locate the PM0966A symbol, Police Lieutenant title or Vernon Township when applying. As noted previously, if a candidate has questions or concerns regarding the application process, there are available resources, *i.e.*, the OAS User Guide and/or technical support, to assist him or her. The appellant does not indicate that he attempted to access the OAS User Guide or contact technical support at the above noted phone number or email address prior to the July 22, 2019 application filing deadline. Again, the appellant provides no explanation as to why he did not stop at any point during the application process and seek assistance.⁵

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this request be denied.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
