

2004 NJ Highlands Water Protection and Planning Act

Legislative findings:

"... that the New Jersey Highlands, because of its proximity to rapidly expanding suburban areas, is at serious risk of being fragmented and consumed by unplanned development; and that the existing land use and environmental regulation system cannot protect the water and natural resources of the New Jersey Highlands against the environmental impacts of sprawl development..."

There isn't a single reference to climate change, or global warming, in the Highlands Act.



172,846,595 tons of carbon stored in NJ's forests:

standing trees: 44%

soil: 42%

deadwood: 9%


roots: 4%

shrubs: 0.1%

Carbon sequestration in forests isn't just about trees



One salamander sequesters 178lbs of carbon per rainy season. 12,500 salamanders/acre = 1,112.5 tons carbon/acre.






Potential carbon offset credit values in Highlands Preservation Area:
