

- The Portal was established in 2009 with seed funding from Virginia
- It was the cornerstone of the regional planning process and the Mid-Atlantic Ocean Action Plan that was completed in 2016 under the Obama-era National ocean Policy
- In recent years, there has been a significant increase in its use by a range of partners, including government, industry, nongovernmental organizations, and educational institutions.

4,000+ map layers organized under 12 themes




All map products have been customized to address regional stakeholder needs and have been reviewed and vetted by experts









Offshore Wind Energy Areas




Point Pleasant Bottom Trawl 2011-2015




Cape May Dredge 2011-2015



Squid Fishing 2015-2016




Tug-Tow Vessels 2016




