The Department of Environmental Protection's Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste is in receipt of a proposed amendment to the Middlesex County District Solid Waste Management Plan (County Plan) dated March 23, 2021. Administrative Action 002-21 to the County Plan proposes County Plan inclusion of the revised hours of operation at the Sakoutis Brothers Transfer Station/Materials Recovery Facility (TS/MRF) located at 2101 Roosevelt Avenue, Block 299, Lot 1 in the Borough of South Plainfield.

Specifically, the following revised hours of operation are included in the County Plan for the Sakoutis Brothers TS/MRF:

- Acceptance of waste: Monday through Friday, 5:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Saturday, 5:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- Processing of waste: Monday through Friday, 5:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
Saturday, 5:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(b)14, the inclusion of revised hours of operation can be accomplished via an administrative action. Therefore, the County Plan inclusion of the revised hours of operation at the Sakoutis Brothers TS/MRF is hereby approved as an administrative action pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(f).

Please be advised that this administrative action approval shall not be construed as an expression of the Department's intent to issue a permit modification to the subject facility for the above noted operational changes.
