Environmental Stewardship Program

Recognition program for regulated sites that engage in environmentally beneficial activities that "go beyond" the minimum regulatory requirements.

No application process - Information verified by C&E inspectors during routine compliance inspections.

Initiated in 2008 - currently 536 participants

Containers in Good Condition

- Marked "Used Oil"
- Burn Only On-Spec Oil Max .5 M BTU/hr
- Stop, Contain, Clean Up Release
- Off-Site by Transporter with EPA ID # (exemption < 55 gal)
- Mix Characteristic HW Manage as HW
- Not Used as Dust Suppressant

WASTE MINIMIZATION

- Pursuing Initiatives to Reduce, Minimize or Eliminate Non-HW Streams
- <u>LOG</u> Costs Assessments, Technology Transfer, Written Plan, Top Management Support
- <u>SOG</u> Verbally Describe Program & Visual Evidence
- Site Specific Depending on Operations & Waste Generated

Written Contract with Private Refuse Firm?

AIR SCREENING

- Used Oil Burners Need Registration or Permit
- Air Permit Required for Bulb Crushers
- Permits required after 1973 for Dip tanks >100 gal, Internal Combustion Engines, Landfill Venting
- Visual Emissions, Odors
- Incinerators Waste Type, Temp.
- Storage Tanks Size, Color, Insulation

WATER SCREENING

Discharges to Surface or Groundwater
Discharge >25,000 Gallons to STP
Discharge Appearance
On Site Wells > 100,000 gal/day – Water Allocation Permit
