

Atlantic Herring

Clupea harengus



Description:

- silvery with brassy colored sides
- dark bluish green back
- pale yellow fins
- dark shoulder spot
- numerous spots on the side behind the shoulder spot
- projecting lower jaw
- large mouth at the tip of the snout
- dorsal fin begins at middle of the body

Size:

• up to 18 inches, usually 12 inches; weigh up to 1.5 pounds

Range:

• Greenland and northern Labrador to North Carolina; uncommon south of New Jersey

Facts:

- large loosely attached scales
- feed mainly on small shrimp or copepods
- can filter feed if there are large enough densities of prey
- preyed on by other fish, birds and marine mammals
