

Fallfish

Semotilus corporalis



Description:

- adults dull sliver, olive to gold-brown on top
- sometimes a purple or blue sheen
- young are bright silver
- mature males will develop pinkish tint to their heads during breeding season
- ♦ rounded snout
- slightly overhanging mouth
- ♦ large eye
- on adult the scales of the back and upper side are darkly outlined
- ♦ 8 dorsal rays
- ♦ 8 anal rays

Size:

♦ up to 17 inches

Range:

 Atlantic slope from New Brunswick to the James River drainage in Virginia; Hudson Bay, Lake Ontario and St. Lawrence drainages

Facts:

- clear streams, lakes, ponds and small to medium rivers with gravel bottom
- doesn't like muddy water
- eats insects, small fish, crayfish and some plant material
- preyed on by other fish and birds
- males construct nests of gravel by carrying stones in their mouths: nests can be 4 feet
- wide and 1.5 feet tall
- ♦ largest minnow native to eastern North America
