

Golden Shiner

Notemigonus crysolecus



Description:

- extremely compressed body
- strong decurved lateral line
- scaleless keel between pelvic and anal fins
- small upturned mouth
- silver in clear but turbid water
- gold sides and fins in brownish water

Size:

♦ up to 12 inches

Range:

- Atlantic and Gulf Slope drainages from Nova Scotia to south Texas
- Great Lakes, Hudson Bay and Mississippi River basins west to Alberta, Montana, Wyoming and west Oklahoma


Facts:

- inhabit well vegetated ponds, lakes, swamps, backwaters and pools of creeks and small to medium rivers
- spawn from May through August
- may spawn 4 to 5 times per season
- eggs are released over and adhere to algae or aquatic plants
- adults do not care for eggs or young
- average lifespan is 3 to 6 years
- social fish
- feed within an hour of sunset on zooplankton, phytoplankton and microcrustaceans
