

Mosquitofish

Gambusia affinis



Description:

- dull gray or brown on top
- silvery sides
- dark diamond pattern
- dark bar below the eye
- usually rows of small black spots on body and caudal fin
- mouth located on top of the head, for feeding purposes

Size:

• usually 1.5 inches, rarely reach over 2 inches

Range:

 New Jersey to south Florida and around the northern Gulf coast of Texas, wide range inland to Illinois

Facts:


- eat mosquito larvae
- give birth to live young
- young look like miniature adults
- tolerant to high water temperatures and low dissolved oxygen levels
- require standing water to develop
