

Northern Snakehead

Channa argus





Description:

- pelvic fins directly behind pectoral fins
- elongate anal fin
- brown with dark blotches
- flattened head
- eyes located in dorsolateral position
- anterior nostrils tubular
- all fins supported by only rays

Size:

maximum size exceeds 33 inches

Range:

 Native range is in China, Russia and Korea but has been found more recently on the East and West coast of the United States

Facts:

- prefers stagnant shallow ponds, swamps, slow streams
- commonly found in muddy substrate or vegetated substrate
- ♦ found in temperatures ranging from o-30°C
- 97% of diet is other fish species

The Northern snakehead is considered an invasive species
