

Northern Stargazer

Astroscopus guttatus



Description:

- dark olive-brown head and body
- evenly distributed small white spots that become larger on sides and towards the tail
- eyes on flattened upper surface of head
- mouth is almost vertical
- three dark horizontal lines on the tail
- black spinous dorsal fin
- fringed lips and nostrils

Size:

• up to 22 inches and 20 pounds, usually 8-18 inches

Range:

♦ New York to North Carolina

Facts:

- produces electricity using an organ located in a pouch behind the eyes
- eats small fish, crabs and other crustaceans
- uses side fins as shovels to burrow below the sand
- buries itself in the sand and waits for prey, then uses its large mouth to create a vacuum to suck prey in
- breathes through its nostrils, not its mouth like most other fish
- during juvenile stages, eyes are on the side of the head before moving to the top
