

Redbreast Sunfish

Lepomis auritus



Description:

- long, narrow, black ear flap
- wavy blue lines on cheek and opercle
- ♦ dark olive back
- sides are greenish yellow brown with yellow flecks
- red orange spots form rows on upper side
- randomly scattered orange spots on lower sides
- orange belly
- short rounded pectoral fins
- large mouth; upper jaw extends under eye pupil

Size:

• up to 9.5 inches

Range:

- native to Atlantic and Gulf Slopes, from New Brunswick to central Florida and west to Apalachicola and Choctawhatchee drainages, Georgia and Florida;
- introduced into Gulf drainages as far west as Rio Grande and in Mississippi River basins as far north as Kentucky and Arkansas


Facts:

- prefer ponds, lakes, streams and smaller, slow moving rivers with sandy bottoms
- feed on insects, snails, crayfish and small fish
- one of seven Lepomis species that do not produce sounds during courtship
- ♦ average lifespan is up to 7 years
- ♦ spawn May to August
- females lay 1000 to 10,000 eggs per season
- males build the nest and guard the eggs
