

Tessellated Darter

Etheostoma olmstedi



Description:

- elongate; olive brown above with 6 dark saddles
- creamy white belly
- upper sides mottled with zigzags
- 9-11 dark mid-lateral 'X' and 'W' shaped markings
- large fins
- dorsal and caudal fins have thin, alternating dark and light bands

Size:

• up to 4.5 inches

Range:

 St. Lawrence and Lake Ontario drainages in south Quebec and southeast Ontario;
Atlantic coast drainages to northeastern Florida (absent in Maine)


Facts:

- spawns in a nest cavity, usually under rocks or logs
- eggs are deposited in a single layer spanning 1-3 inches
- primarily eats algae, fish eggs, insects and crustaceans
- member of the perch family
- prefers sand or mud bottomed lakes, rivers, and streams
