

White Catfish

Ameiurus catus



Description:

- moderately forked tail
- blue to gray black above
- white below
- spine on pectoral fins and dorsal fins serrated
- 4 pairs of barbels; 2 on lower jaw, 1 behind nostrils, 1 split on sides of upper jaw
- chin barbels are most commonly white
- upper jaw extends beyond lower jaw

Size:

• up to 24 inches; more commonly up to 12 inches

Range:

 fresh and brackish waters along Atlantic and Gulf Coast states, from New York to Florida; introduced into Midwest and West Coast states

Facts:


- prefers slow, mud-bottomed pools, open channels and backwaters of small to large rivers, lakes and impoundments
- feed on anything from insects to crustaceans and fish
- average lifespan is 12 to 14 years
- mature at 3 to 4 years
- barbels contain taste buds which help find food in dark, muddy waters
- male and female form saucer shaped nest
- females lay 1000 to 4000 sticky eggs
- males guard and aerate the eggs
- males watch over the fry until they disperse
