Report a suspected harmful algal bloom

 Contact or ingestion may cause illness - Avoid It & Report It! • May look like blue or green spilled paint, pea soup or parallel streaks

Blooms not producing toxins can cause allergic reactions or skin irritation.

• Can produce toxins that are dangerous for humans, pets, livestock and wildlife

• Cyanobacteria, also sometimes known as blue-green algae, are not true algae.

• Freshwater harmful algal blooms in rivers, streams or lakes are caused

• May form dense blooms under suitable environmental conditions: elevated temperatures,
