Hours: Flexible (2 to 5 days per week)

Positions available in Fall, Spring, Summer semesters OR Yearly

The New Jersey Historic Preservation Office has year-round opportunities for student interns. Students, who are currently enrolled in undergraduate or graduate programs in **Historic Preservation, Art/Architecture History, Architecture, Landscape Architecture, History, City Planning or Archaeology**, are eligible to apply.

Our internships offer exposure to a wide range of state and national historic preservation programs. Interns take an active part in procedures such as:

- Evaluation of properties for National Register eligibility (field work may be required).
- Technical assessment of project plans for conformance to the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties.
- Research projects of certain thematic context such as:
 - Architecture in NJ (focusing on any one style, especially post 1950 modern Architecture)
 - Agriculture in NJ (by type or region)
 - Commerce in NJ (commercial centers or specific property types i.e. diners, hotels, banks, etc.)
 - Designed Landscapes in NJ
 - Ethnic Groups
 - Resources associated with Women's History
 - Maritime History

Research could result in an article for the New Jersey *Historic Preservation Bulletin* and/or Power Point presentation.

- Develop or retrieve data for properties considered to be eligible for inclusion in the New Jersey Register of Historic Places.
- Assist in developing our GIS system.

There is also an opportunity for interns to propose and complete an individual project that would contribute to the Office's general mission.
