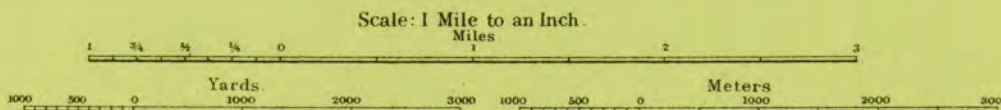


A TOPOGRAPHICAL MAP

NOTE. The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through
which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is
shown by the figures on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is as the figures
will show two (2) feet on the northwestern part and five (5) feet on the remainder
of the map. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point
indicated by a small cross. The dotted lines on the blue ground are lines of equal depth
of water, and the figures accompanying show depth at mean or half tide.
