NOTES.

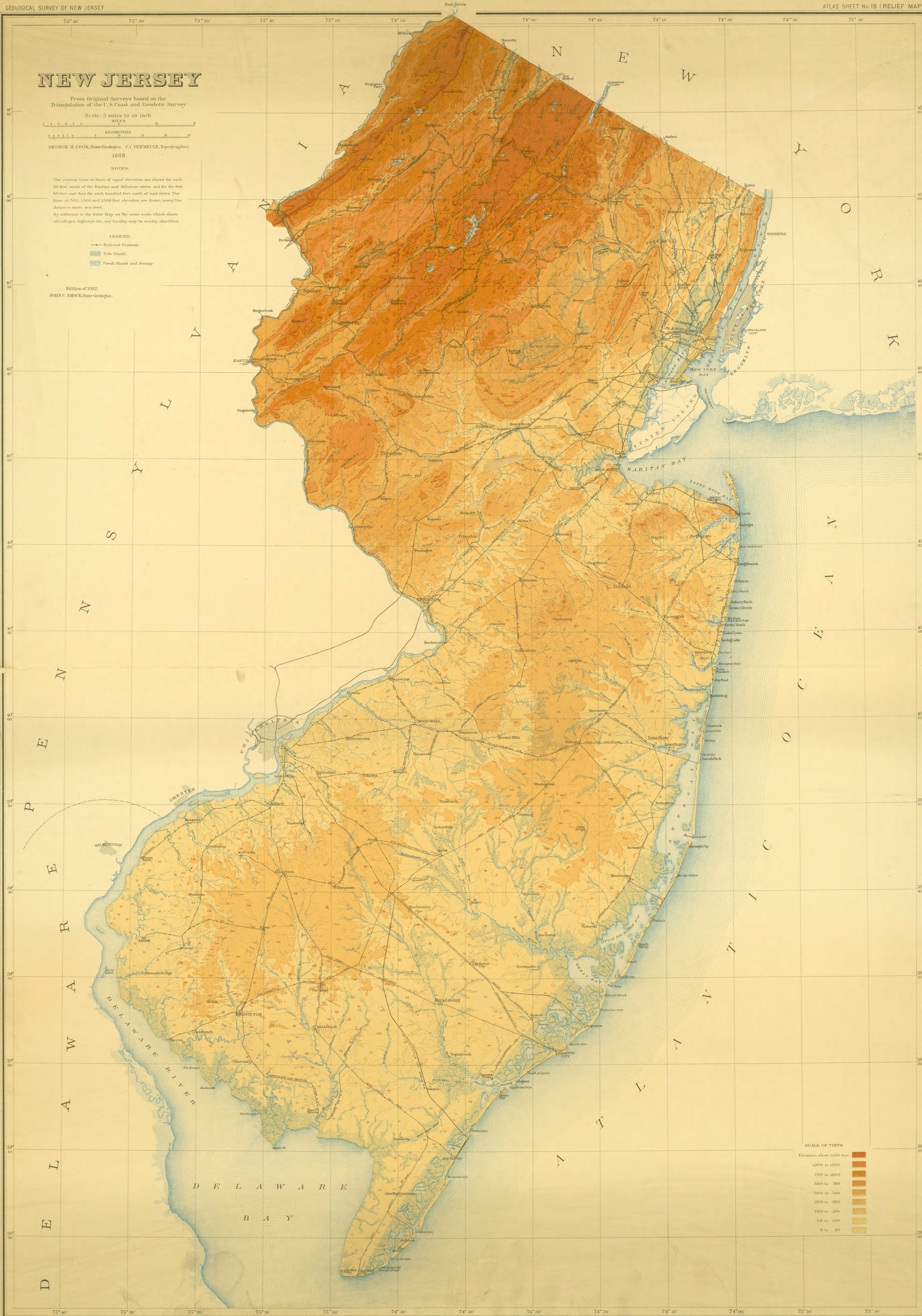
The contour lines or lines of equal elevation are shown for each
50 feet south of the Raritan and Millstone rivers and for the first
50 feet and then for each hundred feet north of said rivers. The
lines at 500, 1000 and 1500 feet elevation are drawn heavy. The
datum is mean sea-level.

By reference to the State Map on the same scale which shows
all villages, highways etc., any locality may be readily identified.
