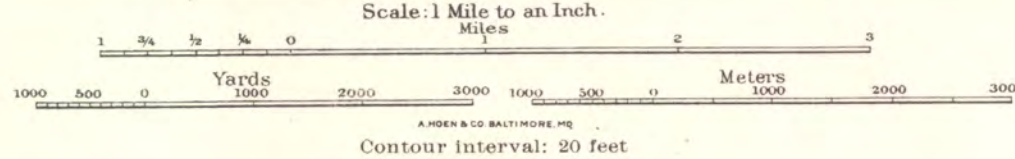
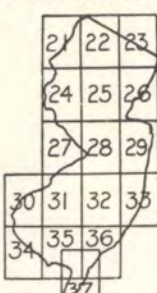


NOTE.—The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figures on the line. The line or hill from any line to the next is, as the figures will show, 20 feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross.

The numbers shown at the borders are for the Plane Coordinate Grid System, based on the N. T. J. Geodetic Control Survey. (The last three digits of the coordinate are omitted, viz.: 1,800, equals 1,800,000 feet.)
