

# GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF NEW JERSEY

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ORIGINAL SURVEY, 1882  
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NOTE.—The contour lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figures on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is, as the figures will show, 10 or 20 feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface as a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on blue ground indicate the depth of water at mean low tide. North of the base line for the areas not contoured data have been taken from the U. S. G. S. sheets.
