



NOTE.—The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above sea level is shown by the figure on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is, as the figure indicates, 100 feet. Figures on blue ground indicate the depth of water at mean low tide. North of the State line for the areas not outlined data have been taken from the U. S. G. S. sheets.
