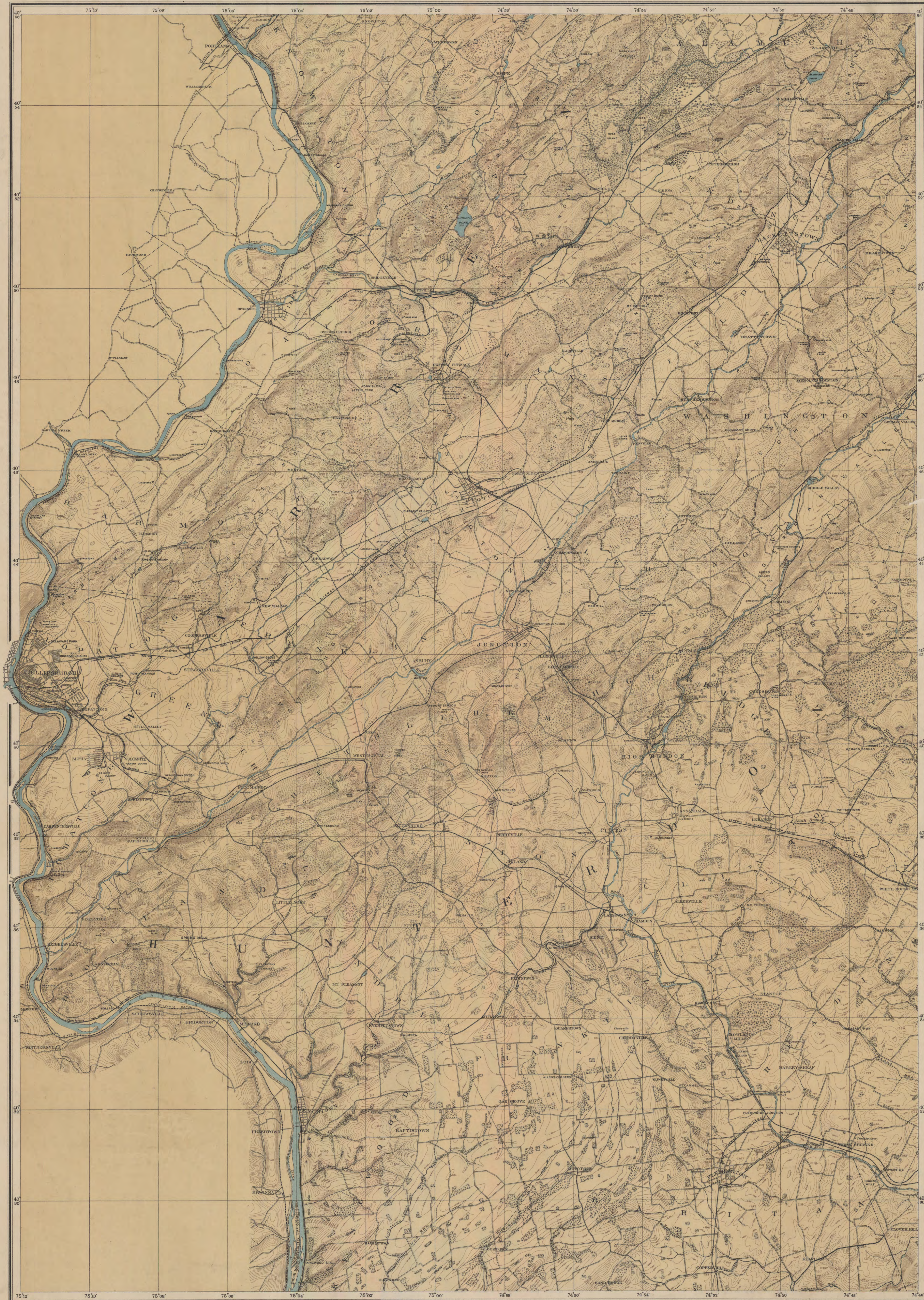

NOTE. The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figures on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is as the figures will show 20 feet. Figures not on an arc line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross.
