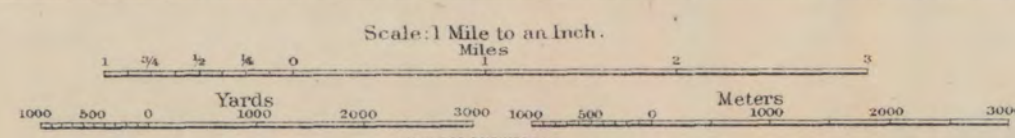

NOTE—The colored lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which the colored lines pass are shown by dots. The line or lines from any line to the next is, as the figure will show, the true line. Figures are not on any line show the actual direction of the water at a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on blue ground indicate the depth of water at low tide.
