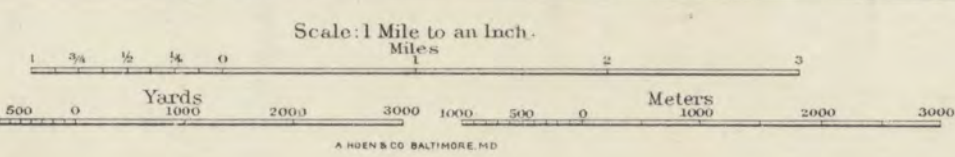
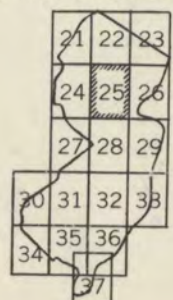




NOTE.—The contour lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figures on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is, as the figures will show, 10 feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on the blue ground indicate the depth of water at mean low tide. The numbers shown in the bottom are for N. 27 Zone Coordinate Grid System. (The last three digits are omitted; e.g., 2,000, equals 2,000,000 feet.)
