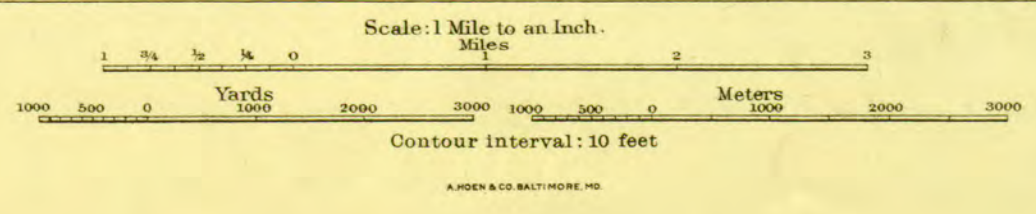

NOTE: The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figure on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is as the figures will show in feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface of a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on blue ground indicate the depth of water at mean low tide.
