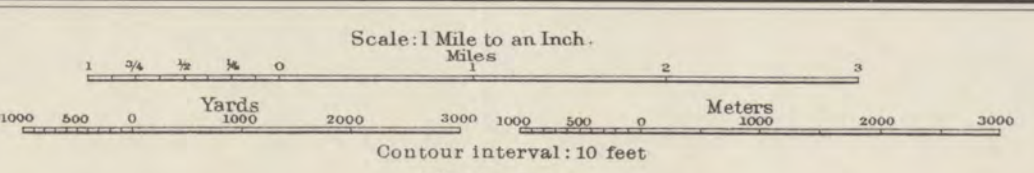
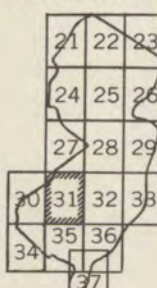


NOTE—The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figure on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is as the figure will show, 10 feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on the line ground indicate the depth of water at mean low tide, but are not related. U. S. Coast Charts should be used for water depths. Elevations shown at the bottom are for N. J. Time Coordinate (Feet System). (The last X=74° 49' 24.000, Y=39° 50' 00.000)
