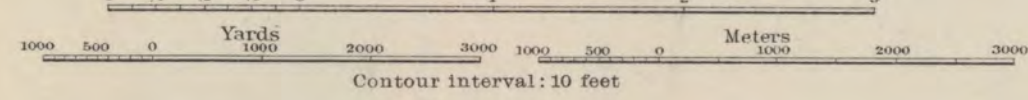


NOTE.—The colored lines are lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figures on the line. The rise or fall from any line to the next is, as the figures will show, 20 or 30 feet. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross. Figures on blue ground except of ponds indicate the depth of water at mean low tide.
