NOTE. The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by figures on the line. The line of high water is the line to the right of the figure with the line (10) feet with some 5 feet contours in Cape May County. Figures not on any line show the actual elevation of the surface at a point indicated by a small cross. The dotted lines on the blue ground are lines of equal depth of water, and the figure accompanying shows depth at mean or half tide.
