

The NJ Living History Advisory Council (NJLHAC) is teaming up with the Mid-Atlantic Region of the Association of Living History, Farm, and Agricultural Museums (ALHFAM) to present a unique historic skills workshop for historians, teachers, interpreters, and other members of the Living History community. The workshop features hands-on skill training and immersive experiences that will help participants bring history to life through the use of safe and authentic programming and interpretation.

Workshops will be taught by experts in the fields of foodways, trades, agri-tainment, animal husbandry, textiles, museum education, black powder safety, and research.
