

TRAIL SENSE AND SAFETY

Be alert, be careful: Parks include natural hazards such as ticks and poison ivy. Horses and bicycles must stay on designated trails or roads; hikers are encouraged to stay on trails. Kayakers, fishermen, clammers, etc., must adhere to basic water safety guidelines. Be aware of changing trail conditions.

Be respectful: Please keep off the dunes as they are critical to the ecology of this area and are sensitive to human impacts. Do not feed or harass wildlife.

Pets: Pets must always be on a leash no longer than six feet in length and under the control of the owner at all times. Pets are not permitted on Tidal Pond or Spizzle Creek Trails. Pets are not permitted on the beach in swim areas during swimming season or near posted beach-nesting bird areas.


Tick Protection: Wear insect repellent, wear lightcolored clothing, tuck pants into socks, stay on trails, check yourself thoroughly, shower and launder clothes immediately.

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TRAILS OF ISLAND BEACH STATE PARK Island Beach State Park is a narrow barrier beach stretching 10 miles between the Atlantic Ocean and Barnegat Bay with 3,000 acres of sandy beaches, maritime forests, tidal marshes and sand dunes. Trailhead: Half a mile south of the park entrance on the bay side. Reed's Road Trail offers a chance to see both the human and natural history of Island Beach State Park. As you walk towards Barnegat Bay, you will pass through a coastal thicket and into mature maritime forest with beautiful examples of pitch pine, oaks and large American hollies. The trail passes the site of the uistoric Reed Hotel, which hosted artists, fishermen and sportsmen in the late 1800s. A model of the hotel is on display in the interpretive center. right branch ad: Directly acros Ocean Swimming the park entrance at parking area 7.
