








The Delaware River

- 330 miles long.
- Interstate boundary its entire length.
- Longest, un-dammed U.S. river east of the Mississippi (dams are located on tributaries, not the main stem Delaware).
- Tidal to Trenton, N.J.





The Delaware River Basin

- ~13 million people (about 5% of the U.S. population) rely on its waters
- Provides half the drinking water to NYC
- Drains 13,539 square miles of watershed in 4 states.
- 6.4 billion gallons are withdrawn every day
- Contributes over \$21B in economic value

A "thermometer" is used to provide the current status of each indicator in this report. For most of the indicators, an arrow appears with the "thermometer," pointing up, if the indicator shows an improving trend or pointing down, if the indicator is worsening. If there is no arrow, no trend is observed.






