

Income Eligibility Guidelines

For Title I, the same criteria for identifying low-income students must be used for public and nonpublic school students. If the district uses income data as of July 1, 2017 the income eligibility guidelines that appear in the chart below would apply. If a district uses data prior to July 1, 2017, then the previous year's income eligibility guidelines would apply.
