## **Acceptable Evidence of Proficiency**

In addition to demonstrating English proficiency through any of the NJDOE English Language Arts graduation requirements, students must demonstrate world language linguistic proficiency through any of the following assessments.

## Languages Other Than English – The following options are acceptable evidence of proficiency in any language for which an assessment is available:

AAPPL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages (AAPPL)	I-3	A level of I-3 is required on all four components of the assessment (across the three modes of communication):  • Interpretive Listening • Interpretive Reading • Interpersonal Listening and Speaking • Presentational Writing
ALIRA ACTFL Latin Interpretive Reading Assessment	I-3	Interpretive Reading Test
AP Advanced Placement language and culture exams	4	Full assessment
ASLPI (ASL) American Sign Language Proficiency Interview	3.0	Full Assessment
IB International Baccalaureate	4	Available only to students currently enrolled in IB programs

OPI Oral Proficiency Interview	Intermediate Mid	Must be taken in conjunction with the WPT
OPIc Oral Proficiency Interview by Computer ®	Intermediate Mid	Must be taken in conjunction with the WPT
SLPI:ASL Sign Language Proficiency Interview	Intermediate Plus	Full Assessment
STAMP Standards-based Measurement of Proficiency	Intermediate Mid	Must achieve a score of 5 or high in all Writing/Speaking and Reading/Listening levels
WPT Writing Proficiency Test ®	Intermediate Mid	Must be taken in conjunction with the OPI or OPIc
Avant WorldSpeak Standards-based Measurement of Proficiency	Intermediate Mid	Must achieve a score of 5 or high in Writing/Speaking

## Assessment for English Language Learners (ELLs)\*

Assessment	Minimum Score	Minimum Requirements/ Notes
ACCESS for ELLs Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners assessment	4 on Tier B or C	A score of 4 or better on Tier B or Tier C of the ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 assessment in all four language domains during the junior year of high school.

<sup>\*</sup>ELLs may demonstrate English language proficiency by attaining the appropriate cut score on the ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 or by meeting any of the <u>graduation requirements</u> listed above <u>in addition</u> to demonstrating proficiency in their native language.

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
